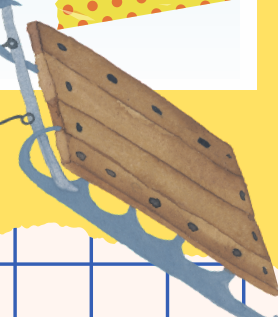

For this issue's restaurant review, I ate at Delicia on 5215 N College Avenue. The atmosphere and service was amazing. From the start, the staff ensured we had the best experience possible. I chose Ceviche Tostada as my appetizer; a tortilla with poached shrimp, citrus sauce and jalapenos. This dish was spectacular! It was tangy and sweet but if you don't like spicy food, you should avoid the jalapenos. Then I had the crispy beef tacos. The tacos tasted amazing and were flavorful. 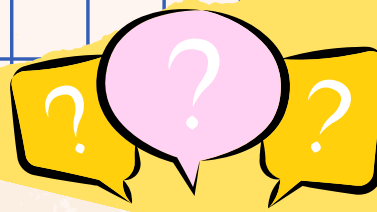

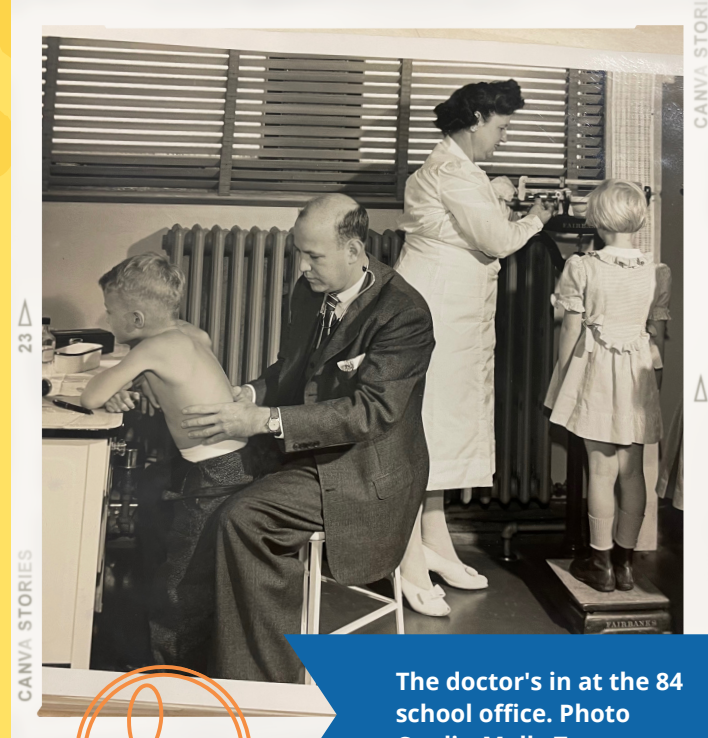

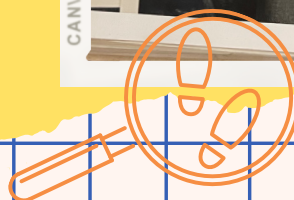
HISTORY MYSTERY

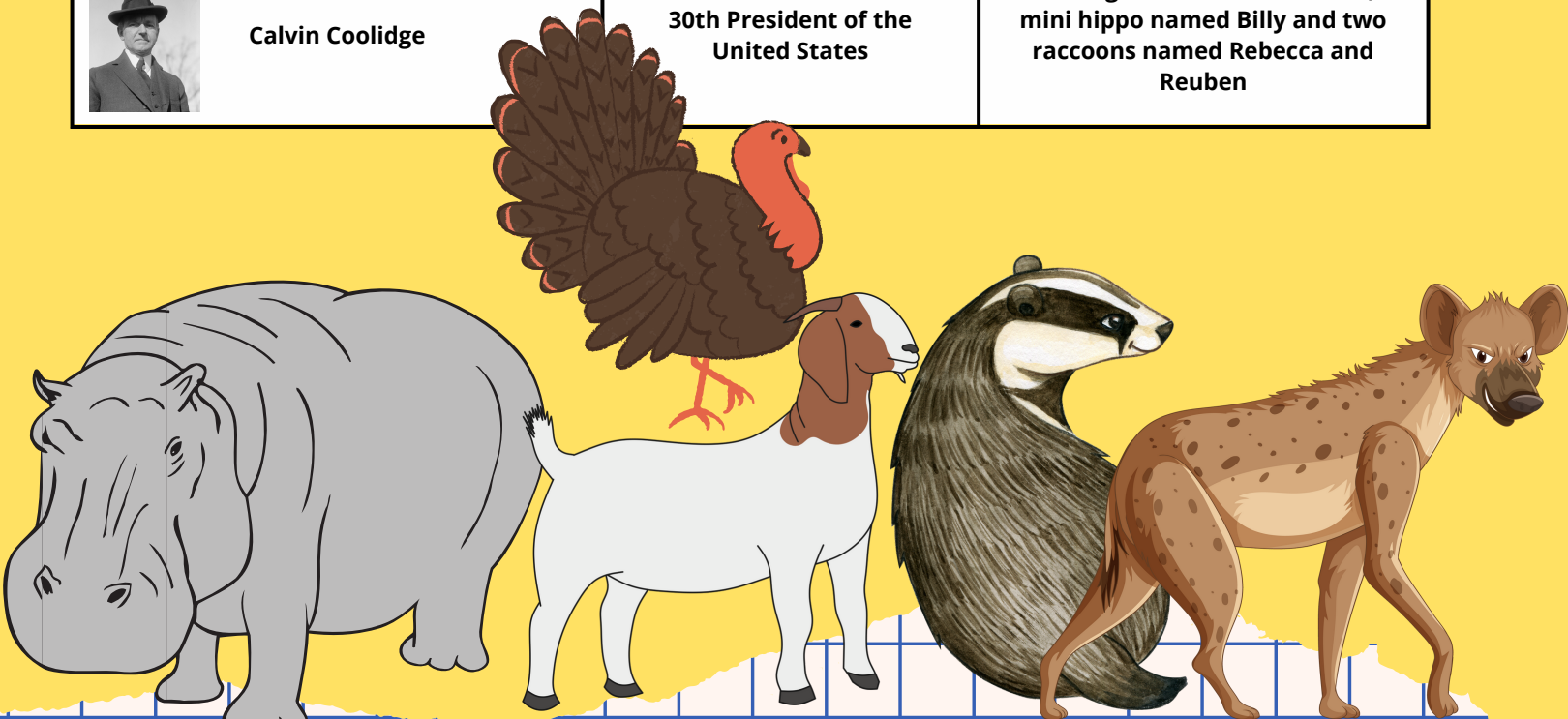
THE FURRY ROYALS

Happy Thanksgiving from the Picklebottoms!

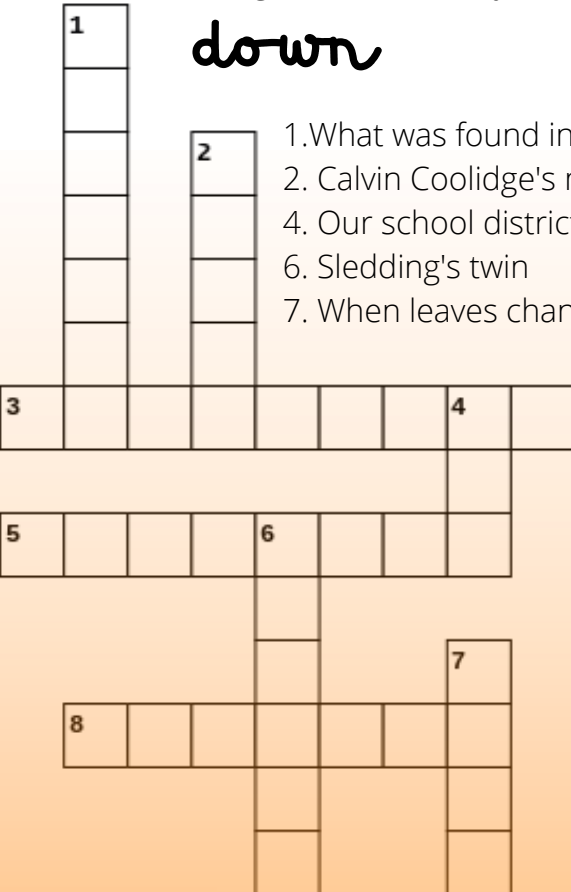
